- Executive compensation and incentives;

- Corporate governance of banks and other financial institutions;

Submission: Deadline for the submission of abstracts is April 15, 2011. Notification of acceptance will be sent to the authors by the mid of May, 2011. Deadline for the submission of final papers is August 30, 2011.

Moreover the Center announces a Best-Paper Award endowed with 1.500 Euros and an Innovative Paper Award endowed with 1.000 Euros. Workshop on Corporate Governance and Investment

This is an informal workshop, where participants from several countries present papers in near publishable form. The idea is to create a forum of international researchers from the field of corporate governance and investment in order to discuss the latest research and its policy implications with respect to the design of corporate governance institutions, and their impact on capital market efficiency and economic growth. It is also the aim of the workshop to encourage and promote young scientists in the research field. Accepted papers are assigned to a discussant to promote discussion and to provide valuable comments on the road to publication. This format has been proven to be of high value for the participants of the past workshop. The first workshop took place at Cambridge University (UK) in 1998 by the initiative of Prof. Dennis Mueller and Prof. Alan Hughes. The following workshops took place in Aarhus (1999), Berlin (2000), Cambridge (2002), Vienna (2003), Palma de Mallorca (2005), Jönköping (2006), Cambridge (2007), Istanbul (2008), Copenhagen (2009) and Barcelona (2010).
