



Master of Science in Maritime Trade & Supply Chain Management

The Master of Science in Maritime Trade and Supply Chain Management is a graduate program that provides managers and supply chain professionals with the knowledge to expand and update their skill sets for enhancing their ability to work with such supply chain partners as transportation carriers, shippers, ports, shipping and shipper agents, warehouse and distribution center managers, customs and various other government agencies that are directly or indirectly involved in the movement of cargo. The **30-credit hour** program requires critical thinking and undertakes investigations of maritime and supply chain industries, including analyses of worldwide port networks and supply chains.

**Professor Wayne Talley, Graduate Program Director,
M.S. in Maritime Trade and Supply Chain Management**

Dr. Talley is the Executive Director, International Maritime, Ports and Logistics Management Institute; Professor of Maritime and Supply Chain Management; Frederick W. Beazley Professor of Economics and Eminent Scholar at Old Dominion University. Honorary positions currently held include: 1) Visiting Professor, Costas Grammenos Centre for Shipping, Trade and Finance, Cass Business School, City University London (UK); 2) Chair Professor, Institute of Traffic and Transportation, National Chiao Tung University (Taiwan); 3) Guest Professor, Shanghai Maritime University (China); and (4) Guest Professor, Faculty of Maritime and Transportation, Ningbo University (China). Visiting positions previously held include: 1) Transport Studies Unit, Oxford University (UK); 2) Institute of Transport Studies, University of Sydney (Australia); and 3) Institute of Transport and Maritime Management, University of Antwerp (Belgium). In 2014, he was President of the Transportation and Public Utilities Group, The American Economic Association and Conference Chair and Host of the Annual Conference of the International Association of Maritime Economists held in Norfolk, Virginia.

Dr. Talley has published over 170 peer-reviewed journal papers and book chapters. Some of which have appeared in such top-ranked journals as: *Transportation Research Part B*, *International Journal of Production Economics*, *Accident Analysis and Prevention*, *Transportation Research Part E*, *International Journal of Forecasting*, etc. He has published 12 academic books including *Port Economics* (Routledge, second edition forthcoming) and *The Blackwell Companion to Maritime Economics* (Wiley-Blackwell, 2012). During 2000-2012, Dr. Talley was Editor-in-Chief of *Transportation Research Part E*. Since 2013, he has served as Honorary Editor-in-Chief of the journal. Currently, he is an Associate Editor of the *Journal of Business Logistics*.

Professor Ling Li, Department Chair, Information Technology, Decision Sciences and Maritime and Supply Chain Management

Dr. Li is Professor of Operations and Supply Chain Management at Old Dominion University. She is a fellow of APICS -- the Association for Operations Management.

Professor Li's expertise includes supply chain management strategies, third-party logistics (3PL), railway freight car scheduling, innovation for competitive advantages in supply chain and operations management, performance measures, firm performance analysis, etc. Professor Li has more than 170 publications in peer-reviewed journals, encyclopedia, book chapters, business cases, and conference papers. She has also published two books on supply chain management in both English and Chinese. Her research awards include the: 1) designation as an E.V. Williams Research Fellow and 2) Best Paper Award at the 5th International Conference on Research and Practical Issues of Enterprise Information Systems. She is a frequent contributor to such top-ranked journals as: *Journal of Operations Management*, *European Journal of Operational Research*, *Annals of Operations Research*, *Transportation Research Part E*, *International Journal of Production Economics*, *International Journal of Production Research*, *Decision Support Systems*, etc.

Dr. Li is a Visiting Full Professor of Hong Kong Polytechnic University, China RenMin University and Shanghai Maritime University. Also, she serves as an area editor of the *Systems Research and Behavioral Science Journal* and is on the editorial board of the *International Journal of Integrated Supply Management*. Dr. Li has been a guest editor for the *International Journal of Production Research* and the *International Journal of Production Economics*.
